REGULATIONS FOR ALL INTERNAL COMPETITIONS

Introduction

Searles Leisure Group has approved the playing of a number of internal competitions throughout the year. Subject to annual confirmation by the Group, the competitions will include:

- Monthly Strokeplay which will alternate between Saturdays and Sundays.
- Monthly Stableford which will alternate between Saturdays and Sundays.
- Maximum Score competitions on midweek and weekend
- Summer single and Fourball Betterball knockout for men and ladies
- Summer Mixed Pairs Greensomes knockout (Trebbick Knockout)
- Winter Foursomes knockout for men and ladies
- Trebbick Mixed Pairs Greensome winter knockout
- Men's Club Championship
- Ladies Club Championship
- Senior (Men's and Ladies) Club Championship
- Espley Manor Ex Cup
- Ladies Cribb Cup
- John Elsdon Senior Men's Order of Merit
- Mixed Foursomes, Fourball, Greensomes competitions (Including Kent Trophy)
- Daly Winter Eclectic
- Winter Pairs League
- Junior Championships
- Midweek Competitions (Stableford and Strokeplay)
- Junior Competitions
- 9 hole stableford competitions as demand determines

These regulations have been produced to provide detailed guidelines as to how each internal competition will be regulated within Heacham Manor Golf Club.

Competition Calendar

The Golf Manager in conjunction with the Handicap and Competitions Committee will be responsible for planning and publishing an Annual Calendar showing all planned competitions, along with any amendments. This will be displayed on the Heacham Manor website and Club Notice boards within the Heacham Manor Pavilion changing rooms.

Rules of Golf

All competitions are Amateur Status and are to be played in accordance with the Rules, as defined by the R&A (Royal and Ancient). In addition to the R&A Rules, Local Rules are in force and are displayed on each Scorecard. Due to the newness of the course additional Temporary Rules have also been issued; these will be continually reviewed as the course matures.

It is the responsibility of individual competitors to ensure that they are fully conversant with all Rules, including local and temporarily issued ones.

Distance Measuring Devices

For all play at this course, a player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distances only. If during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance-measure device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g., gradient, wind speed, temperature etc), the player is in breach of rule 14-3, for which the penalty is Matchplay – Loss of hole Stroke play – Two Strokes. For subsequent Offence – Disqualification. Only if the function (other than distance measurement) is used.

Mobile Phones

The use of mobile phones in competitions is prohibited. Any distraction caused to playing partners by use of a phone or the ringing of that phone not turned to silent will incur a 2 shots penalty (Strokeplay & Stableford) or loss of hole in match play for the phone owner.

Handicapping

Introduction – A golf handicap index allows players of all levels of golfing ability to compete against each other on a fair and equal basis. Thus, a handicap system is essential to the popularity and prosperity of the game of Amateur Golf. The club uses the World Handicap System (WHS); thus, providing a player with a golf handicap index that reflects their playing ability relative to that of all other players.

Why have a Handicapping System? – To promote the development of golf at Affiliated Clubs by providing a Handicapping System which produces golf handicaps that allow amateur players, male, female and juniors, of significantly varying abilities to compete against each other on as equitable a basis as possible.

Every player has a number of responsibilities which they must ensure be carried out; *please see section 2; Responsibility of the Player / Club Member for more information.*

The information detailed below is a summary of some of the frequently asked questions and aspects of the unified system which may affect you, the player.

To gain a Handicap Index: For new golfers to gain their Handicap Index they will have to submit a minimum of 54 holes (using any combination of 9 and 18 holes). Their Handicap Index will be the lowest of their three rounds minus two strokes and continue to be built until the 20 scores are achieved.

Each card must be marked and signed by a responsible person acceptable to the Handicap committee.

The committee have declared a responsible person to be: A Golfer holding a valid Handicap index in accordance with England Golf WHS.

Use of the England Golf App – Authorised for use on the Golf Course where the Marker is present during the Full Round.

Annual Review: Each year prior to 1st March the handicap committee carries out an annual review for all players with Heacham Manor as their home club for handicapping. This review is conducted in compliance with WHS.

Home club: All players may have one handicap index only to be allotted and adjusted by the WHS, and if so required a handicap certificate may be produced (please see a member of staff). Any person who is a member of more than one club must select one club as their home club and notify that club and the other of his choice (Stated as 'Away' on handicapping sheet). Any person playing a stroke play competition at a club other than their home club must submit their card from the competition to his / her home club for handicapping purposes, or ensure it is reported via the membership number.

Appeal process for any decision made by the Handicap Committee.

In the event of a handicap dispute, a member will first bring their concerns to the Handicap Committee. If there is no satisfactory resolution the member may take their issue to Paul Searle, Director of Golf, and finally, if all else fails, to the Norfolk County Golf Union.

Competition Handicapping Rules

Handicap limits and status to play in the various competitions are detailed in Section 2 and the appendices for all individual competitions.

The Handicap and Competition Committee will identify those competitions that are 'non-qualifying'; for these competitions, the result will have no effect on an individual's handicap.

Tee Time Allocation for competitions

Heacham Manor Golf Course is open to both members and non-members. During Club Championships, tee times will be blocked out and allocated to all competitors; this should ensure that play goes ahead without interference from other 'non-competitive' golfers. Other competitions unless specified on information sheets competitors will normally be required to arrange their own tee times.

Starting Tees:

For all qualifying competitions (non-tee timed events) play must start off the 1st tee, (13th or 16th tee starts for example are not permitted).

Social Mixed Competitions:

Social mixed competitions on a Saturday or Sunday will have a 10am tee time off the 1st tee.

Signing up for events

All tee timed events entries will only be accepted on the online tee booking system subject to the deadlines specified for the competitions.

Roll up events, must be signed up prior to playing on the competition sign-up sheet either in The Pavilion golf shop or Searles Golf Club shop.

Competition closing dates.

When a deadline for competitions is set, entries after the closing dates are not allowed.

Where a separate organisational committee is present (for example Open competitions) it is up to that committee to allow more entries after the closing date.

Withdrawal from tee timed completion

Withdrawal without valid reason once a draw has been completed will result in entry not allowed to the next tee timed event. Valid reason- subject to committee.

Cards from competitions

All cards must be returned to the committee (Even if no score has been recorded) if not returned cards will be processed as DQ, under rule 3-3b and entry not allowed into next equivalent competition (Midweek or Weekend).

The exception to this DQ will be with provision of a valid reason- subject to committee.

Use of Ride on Buggies

The use of buggies within competitions at Heacham Manor Golf Club is only allowed by those in possession of doctors Medical Certificate, or by those suffering from a disability within the meaning of section 6 of the Equality Act 2010.

The Competition & Handicap Committee in conjunction with the Golf Manager or Director of Golf can temporarily allow the use of buggies for individuals after injury or illness with proof of doctors Medical Certificate.

The use of buggies in competitions without the appropriate documentation will result in disqualification from the competition.

*Within Pairs game – partners clubs may be transported on the buggy, but the player may not ride in the buggy.

These people will also have '(ME)' indicated alongside their name on the handicap / membership lists.

Lighting or abnormal weather stopping play.

In the event lightning / abnormal weather stopping play during a competition, if more than ¾ of the field completes the game, the competition results will stand. For those who cannot complete their round (if the course has not reopened for rest of the day) a credit will be issued for entry fees. If the player chooses not to resume play (once the course has reopened) no credit is offered and a NR is counted.

Heacham Manor Golf Club Fog Policy

Sight Rule Prior to play:

No play will commence on the course if a distance of 200 yards cannot be seen. If it is not possible to clearly see the Heacham Manor 1st Tee from the Pavilion, players must not start to play golf.

Prior to play, at the point of signing in, golfers will be advised of the conditions by the Golf Manager, or Golf Managers Assistant (On occasion via member of the Golf Team).

If golfers are unable to play at their scheduled time, reasonable endeavours will be made to reschedule either later that day or the following day depending on availability.

On the course:

In the event of fog forming while on the golf courses, the decision to stop or continue play lies with the golfer, as it is recognised that conditions can change from minute to minute.

Whilst on the course, players must use their own judgement based on the distances demonstrated from the club house.

Organised Events:

In an organised event, the decision to suspend or stop play lies with the Management team, in which case a Claxon will sound once to suspend play.

The decision to then restart play will lie with the Management team. For club competitions if play cannot re-commence credit will be issued for fees paid. In Match play games, if they cannot continue that day then they should be arranged asap to the next available time suitable to the players, continuing from where the match was suspended.

Entry Fees

Entry fees will be set by the appointed Competition & Handicap Committee in association with the Director of Golf and Golf Manager.

Entry fee receipts will only be used for competition prizes.

Minimum entry fee is £2.00 per person for each competition.

Club Championship competitions are £4.00 per person.

Entry fees for competitions will NOT be refunded after play has commenced.

The Golf Manager will be responsible for the safe keeping and accountancy of all entry fee receipts.

Prizes

Competition prizes are presented as soon as possible after each competition and will be available for collection from the Pavilion within 1 week of the event. Additional monthly medals and trophies for major competitions will be presented at the Annual Club Dinner.

The standard breakdown of prizes is based on the number of competitors in the competition (Club championships allocation is detailed in the individual championship rules).

Under 20 ppl playing – 1st Prize only. 100% of entry in prizes.

20 to 30ppl playing – 1st & 2nd Prizes. 1st receives approx. 60% of the entry, 2nd 40%.

30 + playing – 1st, 2nd & 3rd all receives prizes. 1st receives approx. 50% of the entry, 2nd 30%, 3rd 20%

Acceptable Marker in Competitions

Qualifying Competitions: Member with a handicap index playing in the Qualifying competition.

Card must not be marked by someone NOT in the competition. Mixed sex pairs may mark cards providing both are in their respective competitions.

Pairs Competitions: When odd numbers occur in non-qualifying competitions, it is up to the random computer drawn single pair to find a suitable marker (Member with a handicap index) to mark their card. In the event that a marker cannot be found then pair will have to withdraw their entry. (Pre-paid Entries will be credited to future events). *Foursome competitions can be played with 3 teams.*

Texas Scramble Competition: As a team game no marker is required, the team captain can complete the scorecard.

Markers Name on the Card: There is no official requirement for the markers name to be printed on the card, however it would be appreciated if the markers name was included in box D, subject to local rule changes.

Regulations

The regulations regarding internal competitions are detailed in this document (See Sections 1 and 2).

Review

These regulations will be reviewed annually by the Golf Manager and Handicap and Competition Committee.

SECTION 1 – GENERAL RULES FOR ALL COMPETITIONS

Entry Fees – Entry fees must be paid before teeing off. In the event of a competition being cancelled, all entry fees will be credited for future events.

Registration – Competitors must register before the start of the competition. Competition registers are available at both the Searles Resort Golf and Country Club or Heacham Manor Pavilion.

Note – Returned Scorecards will be checked against those names listed on the Competition Registers.

Tees – All male competitors are to play from the WHITE Tees, unless otherwise stated. All female competitors are play from the RED Tees.

Winter Tee Positions – Between 1st November and 28th February (depending on course conditions) the white tee markers will move position to the yellow stones. Play for all men's competitions will still be off the competition tees of the day and will be used for handicapping purposes.

Withdraw from competition – If for any reason, a player cannot continue to play, he/she may retire but will be automatically eliminated from the competition (no score to count and no refund of Entry Fee) unless otherwise stated.

Completed Scorecard – All completed Scorecards are to be entered on the Touch Screen and then placed in the scorecard box in the Pavilion.

Note – Scorecards are not to be returned to any other outlet, i.e. bar staff, green keeping staff etc.

All cards must be returned to the committee (Even if no score has been recorded) if not cards will be processed as DQ, under rule 3-3b and entry not allowed into next equivalent competition (Midweek or Weekend).

The exception to this DQ will with provision of a valid reason- subject to committee.

Competition Results – Competition results will be published on the Heacham Manor website and Club Notice boards within the Searles Resort Golf and Country Club and Heacham Manor Hotel Pavilion.

Tied Positions – In the event of a tie, count back will be used in accordance with CONGU count back rules to establish final places (excluding Club Championships where a play-off will take place)

Handicap Limits - Maximum handicaps have been set for specific competitions. Please refer to individual competitions for clarification.

Non-Competition Handicaps – There are restrictions to the competitions that non-competition handicap holders are able to enter. Please refer to individual competitions for clarification.

Competition Divisions - All Sunday events will have 2 divisions of a Handicap Index of +2.0 to 18.0 in Division 1. Handicap Index of 18.1 to 54.0 in Division 2.

APPENDIX A – HEACHAM MANOR –MONTHLY COMBINED STROKEPLAY COMPETITION

- A.1 Open to all male AND female members of Heacham Manor Golf Club with a handicap index to a maximum of 54.
- A.2 Competition to consist of 18 holes (Strokeplay), starting at the 1st.
- A.3 The competition will be cancelled if less than 5 members register for the competition.
- A.4 Men and ladies will compete against each other in the same competition. Men play off the white tees and ladies play off the red tees.
- A.5 Handicap allowance in accordance with WHS.
- A.6 Scoring will be the gross score for the completed round minus any handicap allowance.
- A.7 This competition will be played on average once a month.

APPENDIX B – HEACHAM MANOR –MONTHLY COMBINED STABLEFORD COMPETITION

- B.1 Open to all male AND female members of Heacham Manor Golf Club with a handicap index to a maximum of 54.
- B.2 Competition to consist of 18 holes (stableford), starting at the 1st hole.
- B.3 The competition will be cancelled if less than 5 members register for the competition.
- B.4 Men and ladies will compete against each other in the same competition.
- B.5 Handicap allowance in accordance with WHS.
- B.6 Scoring – Each competitor will play against the par of each hole and receives points according to how he scores in relation to par (The score is the net score for each hole dependent on the player's handicap)

The scoring system is as follows:

2 or more over par	= 0 points
1 over par	= 1 point
Par	= 2 points
1 Under par	= 3 points
2 Under par	= 4 points
3 Under par	= 5 points

APPENDIX C – HEACHAM MANOR – COMBINED MAXIMUM SCORE COMPETITION

- C.1 Open to all male AND female members of Heacham Manor Golf Club with a handicap index to a maximum of 54.
- C.2 Competition to consist of 18 holes (Strokeplay), starting at the 1st.
- C.3 The competition will be cancelled if less than 5 members register for the competition.
- C.4 Men and ladies will compete against each other in the same competition. Men play off the white tees and ladies play off the red tees.
- C.5 Handicap allowance in accordance with WHS.
- C.6 Maximum Score for any individual hole is gross 5 over par.
- C.7 A “no return” cannot be submitted as all incomplete holes will be credited with the maximum score.
- C.8 This competition will be played on average once a month.

APPENDIX D – HEACHAM MANOR – WEDNESDAY STROKEPLAY COMPETITION

- D.1 There will be two separate competitions (male and female) open to all male and female members with a handicap index to a maximum of 54.
- D.2 Competition to consist of 18 holes (Strokeplay), starting at the 1st hole.
- D.3 The competition will be cancelled if less than 5 Male & 3 Lady members register for the competition.
- D.4 This is normally a 'Roll up' competition, as such members are responsible for organising their own tee times and playing partners (who must be with a fellow competitor)
- D.5 Handicap allowance in accordance with WHS.
- D.6 Scoring will be the gross score for the completed round minus any handicap allowance.

APPENDIX E – HEACHAM MANOR – WEDNESDAY MONTHLY STABLEFORD COMPETITION

- E.1 There will be two separate competitions (male and female) open to all male and female members with a handicap index to a maximum of 54.
- E.2 Competition to consist of 18 holes (stableford), starting at the 1st hole
- E.3 The competition will be cancelled if less than 5 Male & 3 Lady members register for the competition.
- E.4 This is normally a 'Roll up' competition, as such members are responsible for organising their own tee times and playing partners (who must be with a fellow competitor).
- E.5 Handicap allowance in accordance with WHS.
- E.6 Scoring – Each competitor will play against the par of each hole and receives points according to how he scores in relation to par (The score is the net score for each hole dependent on the player's handicap)

The scoring system is as follows:

2 or more over par	= 0 points
1 over par	= 1 point
Par	= 2 points
1 Under par	= 3 points
2 Under par	= 4 points
3 Under par	= 5 points

APPENDIX F – HEACHAM MANOR – WEDNESDAY MONTHLY MAXIMUM SCORE COMPETITION

- F.1 There will be two separate competitions (male and female) open to all male and female members with a handicap index to a maximum of 54.
- F.2 Competition to consist of 18 holes (strokeplay), starting at the 1st hole.
- F.3 The competition will be cancelled if less than 5 Male & 3 Lady members register for the competition.
- F.4 This is normally a 'Roll up' competition, as such members are responsible for organising their own tee times and playing partners (who must be with a fellow competitor).
- F.5 Handicap allowance in accordance with WHS.
- F.6 A "no return" cannot be submitted as all incomplete holes will be credited with the maximum score.

Please note, Maximum Score for any individual hole is gross 5 over par.

APPENDIX G – HEACHAM MANOR – SUMMER SINGLES COMPETITION

- G.1 There will be two separate competitions (male and female) open to all male and female members with a valid handicap index. Players with Handicaps above 28 (Men) and 36 (Ladies) may enter but must play off a maximum Course Handicap of 28 (Men), 36 (Ladies).
- G.2 Competition to consist of 18 holes (Matchplay) off the white tees (men) red tees (ladies). Matches commence play off the 1st tee.
- G.3 Competitors must register before the competition start date (Normally the 1st May).
- G.4 A competition will be cancelled if less than; 8 male members or 4 female members register for the competition.
- G.5 Both players should make equal effort to contact the other individual. The top player should then offer a minimum of three dates to play two of which must be at weekends. If the dates offered are not available for the bottom player, then the bottom player must offer alternative dates. Please speak to the Golf Manager / Head of Golf if communication difficulties arise which mean that the match cannot go ahead in a timely manner.

Please do not leave this contact to the last days available.

Deadlines for all matches will be on Sundays.

All dates will be rigidly enforced. Matches must be played by the specified date, no extensions will be offered for any reason.

If a match has not been played by the set date (Sundays) and one player tees off on the first tee prior to 11am on the final date, they will be awarded the match irrespective of whether they are on the top or bottom of the list. If neither player turns up to play both players will be eliminated.

- G.6 Full handicap allowance will be permitted – The higher handicapper is allocated a handicap based upon the net difference between his/her and that of the lower handicapper taken from the course handicap. Shots to be taken in relation to the Stroke Index. If both competitions have the same handicap it is effectively a scratch competition.
- G.7 Scoring – Each hole is played as an individual competition, the winner of the hole is the competitor who scores the lowest net score (Gross score minus any handicap allowance for that particular hole), and is awarded '1 point'. If both competitors have the same net score then the hole is 'halved' (no score).
- G.8 The winner is the competitor who has more 'points' than holes left to play. At this point the competition is over and there is no need to play the remaining un-played holes.
- G.9 There is no need to submit a Scorecard for this competition.
- G.10 In the event that competitors are tied after 18 holes; competitors will start another round as if there were starting all over again. This time it will be 'sudden death', the first competitor to win a hole will win the match. When starting another round competitors will be entitled to the same handicap allowance as the first round.
- G.11 Once started; if the competition has to be stopped due to the course being unplayable or weather conditions, the scores will be recorded and once play can resume (even on another day) the match will continue from where it left off. The score will be as it stands if no other dates are available.
- G.12 The winner of each competition is responsible for updating the Singles Matchplay Sheet on the Club Notice board within the Heacham Manor Pavilion changing rooms and the PSI Board (Touchscreen) in the Pavilion Foyer.

G.13 1st Prize only unless more than 6 entrants. Then 1st gets 60% 2nd get 40%.

APPENDIX H – HEACHAM MANOR – SUMMER FOURBALL BETTERBALL COMPETITION

- H.1 There will be two separate competitions (male and female) open to all male and female members with a Handicap Index. Player with Handicaps of above 28 (Men) and 36 (Ladies) may enter but must play off a maximum Course Handicap of 28 (Men), 36 (Ladies).
- H.2 Competition to consist of 18 holes (Matchplay) off the white tees (men) red tees (ladies). Matches commence play off the 1st tee.
- H.3 Competitors must register before the competition Start Date (Normally the 1st May).
- H.4 A competition will be cancelled if less than; 8 male teams or 4 female teams register for the competition.

Male members of the club must have a handicap index. Handicaps of above 28 (Men) may enter but must play off a maximum course handicap of 28.

- W.4 In the event of a player's handicap increasing during the qualifying period, a maximum playing handicap index of 28 (36 for Ladies) will be allowed.
- W.5 A maximum of 10 rounds can be played, these can be played during other club competitions, but separate cards would need to be submitted.
- W.6 Each golfer signs eclectic sheet prior to playing each round declaring his intention to submit an eclectic scorecard (The sign-up sheet will be in the golf shop)
- W.7 A member with a current handicap must score and sign the card.
- W.8 Play will be off the yellow tee markers for the men and red tee markers for the ladies.
- W.9 In the event that a full round is not completed (ie 9 or 12 holes due to weather), cards must still be submitted and will count as one of the 10.
- W.10 After each round the cards are signed by the player and marker, then submitted into the scorecard box in the Pavilion for processing.
- W.11 The cards are processed and the score on each hole is compared to the previous round, the lowest score made on each hole is then recorded for the eclectic score producing one 18-hole score from the 10 rounds.
'Example being – round one the player shoots 5 on the first hole, on the second round they shoot 4 on the first hole, the 5 is then replaced by the 4'
(The club official will process the eclectic cards weekly).
- W.12 Current scores will be displayed on the club notice board as well as on online Masters scoreboard.
- W.13 After the competition date period has concluded the player with the lowest medal score will be declared the winner, handicaps are deducted from the final card at 50% so the winner will be the lowest nett score.
'Example medal score 68, players handicap 10 @ 50% is 5 shots. Nett score total 63.
- W.14 The prize fund will be split as follows:
Under 10 ppl playing - 1st Prize only (100%)
10 to 20ppl playing - 1st (60%) & 2nd (40%)
20 + playing - 1st (50%), 2nd (30%) & 3rd (20%).
- The Trophies will be presented at the presentation evening, Prize money will put on the Reward card.

APPENDIX X – HEACHAM MANOR – WINTER MIXED PAIRS LEAGUE

- X.1 This is a mixed pairs competition open to male and female members with maximum course handicap of 54.
- X.2 Competition is a round robin or league format (depending on numbers, see below) with all players arranging their own matches, within the set time period: Start date Friday 1st November - Final date for playing to be last Sunday in March. If league format due to number of pairs, then the matches will need to be played by the 2nd Sunday in March. The final 2 weeks will be for the league finals to be completed by 31st March.
- X.3 Matches are played in greensome match play format – Mens white Tees – Ladies Red Tees Lowest course Handicap X 0.6 plus higher course handicap X 0.4
- X.4 Shots to be taken off the ladies' stroke index.
- X.5 The purpose of the league is to encourage pairs to play at the weekend, but matches can be played in the midweek if necessary.
- X.6 Points:
3 Points for a win
2 Points for a draw
1 for a loss/playing
- X.7 Should any pair withdraw during the competition dates, points they have accrued will be deducted from for all matches played against that pair.
- X.8 Arrangement/score sheet to be kept in the Pavilion competitions folder.
- X.9 Entry fees - £5.00 per couple.
- X.10 Pairs should enter in the competition folder in the Pavilion before 28th October.
If a player requires a partner, individual names should be added to the sheet to allow other players to partner up.
- X.11 If less than 4 pairs enter, the competition will be cancelled. If more than 10 pairs, then the competition will be split into 2 (two) leagues. If more than 18 pairs, then split into 3 leagues.
- X.12 The winner is the pair with the highest number of points after the final date. (Less than 10 pairs format). In the event of different groups scoring the same number of points, the winner will be decided on the number of individual match wins.
- 2 league formats.** - Once all matches are played then the top two from each league will play against each other in knockout format, 1st in League 1, plays 2nd in league 2 and vice versa, then winners from each game (knockout format), play off in final match.
- 3 League format** - The winners of each league will play each other round robin format and the winner is the pair with the most points, in these 3 leagues round robin there can be no draws.
- X.13 1st Prize only unless more than 6 pairs. Then 1st gets 60% 2nd get 40%.

APPENDIX Y – HEACHAM MANOR – JUNIOR COMPETITIONS

Currently the setup for juniors is under the control of the Head of Golf & Golf Manager; the juniors from both the Heacham Manor Golf Club and Searles Golf and Country Club are integrated together.

The Head of Golf & Golf Manager currently administers and runs all junior competitions; as such it is felt that it would be improper for Heacham Manor Golf Club to set out the competition rules for juniors.

When the club junior section is better established, then would be a more appropriate time to identify and set up what junior competitions the club would wish to run on a regular basis.

Note – As with all internal competitions this would be reviewed on an annual basis.

There are no issues with juniors participating in the club competitions listed within this document; the only criteria to be met would be that they have a WHS handicap index and that they follow the guidelines already published within the Heacham Manor Safeguarding Policy document.

- Z.7 A member with a current handicap must score and sign the card.
- Z.8 Play will be off the White tee markers (Men) Red tee markers (Ladies).
- Z.9 In the event that a full round is not completed (i.e. 9 or 12 holes due to weather), cards must still be submitted and will count as one of the 10.
- Z.10 After each round the cards are signed by the player and marker, then submitted into the scorecard box in the Pavilion for processing.
- Z.11 The cards are processed and the score on each hole is compared to the previous round, the lowest score made on each hole is then recorded for the eclectic score producing one 18-hole score from the 10 rounds.
' Example being – round one the player shoots 5 on the first hole, on the second round they shoot 4 on the first hole, the 5 is then replaced by the 4'
(The club official will process the eclectic cards weekly).
- Z.12 Current scores will be displayed on the club notice board as well as on online Masters scoreboard.
- Z.13 After the competition date period has concluded the player with the lowest medal score will be crowned the winner, handicaps are deducted from the final card at 50% so the winner will be the lowest nett score.
'Example medal score 68, players handicap 10 @ 50% is 5 shots. Nett score total 63.
- Z.14 The prize fund will be split as follows:
Under 10 ppl playing - 1st Prize only. (100%)
10 to 19ppl playing - 1st (60%) & 2nd (40%)
20 + playing - 1st (50%), 2nd (30%) & 3rd (20%)

Handicapping: Responsibility of the Player / Club Member:

Under WHS CONGU (Council of National Golf Unions) guidelines each player has a number of responsibilities which they must ensure are carried out, any player who fails to carry out the responsibilities is not entitled to a WHS handicap index.

The player must:

1. Have one Exact Handicap index only which must be allotted and adjusted by their Home Club and produce, if so required, a current, validated Handicap Certificate and/or valid Membership ID Number. The Playing Handicap calculated from this Exact Handicap index shall apply elsewhere including other clubs of which the player is a Member.
 2. If he is a Member of more than one Affiliated Club, select one as his Home Club for handicapping purposes and notify that club and the others of his choice and supply each away club their Home Club Membership ID Number.
For ease of handicap administration, it is recommended that in circumstances where a player is a Member of more than one Affiliated Club, they should select as their Home Club, the club at which they compete most frequently in Qualifying Competitions.
 3. Not change their Home Club except by giving advance notice of the change which can take effect only at the end of a calendar year unless they have ceased to be a Member of their Home Club or both clubs agree to the change taking place at an earlier date.
 4. Report to their Home Club the names of all other Affiliated Clubs of which they are, becomes, or ceases to be, a Member and report to all other Affiliated Clubs of which they are a Member:
 - (a) the name of their Home Club and any changes of Home Club
 - (b) their Home Club membership ID Number
 - (c) alterations to their Handicap index made by their Home Club.
 5. Prior to playing in any competition ascertain whether all appropriate reductions to Handicap index have been made.
 6. Before commencing play on the day of a Qualifying Competition ensure that their entry has been registered in the competition record, manually or by computer in the manner required by the club or committee in charge of the competition.
A player who fails to enter a Qualifying Competition in the required manner is deemed to have neither a score for the competition nor a score for handicap purposes.
 7. Enter their current Handicap index on all cards returned in a Qualifying Competition even though the event may not be a handicap competition.
 8. Ensure that all competition cards in Qualifying Competitions, whether or not complete, are returned to the organising committee, and make such computer entries as may be required.
- Note: It is expected that every player who enters a Qualifying Competition intends to complete the round.**
9. When competing away from their Home Club produce, on request, a current Handicap Certificate authenticated by their Home Club and/or a valid membership ID Number. A Member playing in a Nine-Hole Qualifying Competition or returning a Nine-Hole Supplementary Score at their Away club is responsible for verifying that their correct Exact Handicap index is applied in the calculation of Competition Handicap Allowance.
 10. Report to their Home Club as soon as practicable all Qualifying Scores (including 'No Returns' and Disqualified Scores) returned away from their Home Club advising the Home Club of the date of the Qualifying Competition, the venue together with details specific to the competition format.
